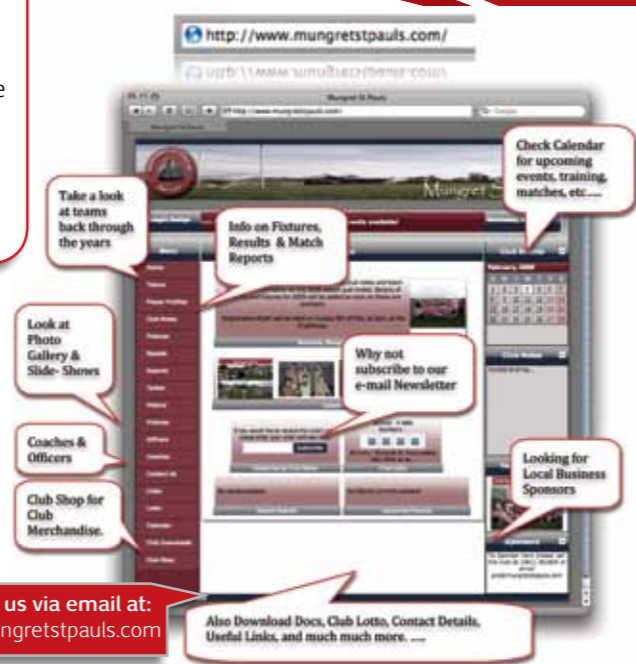

A word from the Club Chairpersons

Mungret/St Pauls GAA Club supports and encourages the development of Gaelic Games in our Parish. It is a central focus of activity within the community catering for members from six years of age right up to adult level. At adult level we field intermediate hurling and football teams, under 21 hurling & football and minor hurling & football. We have a very vibrant underage section in the club with over 200 members. Our club caters equally for males and females. Our Ladies Football club is presently the largest and one of the most successful Ladies Gaelic Football clubs in Limerick catering for girls from under 7 up to adult level. In February of this year our camogie club was formed, and it caters for girls up to 14 years of age and already has up to 80 members. The club through the Club-School Initiative has close links with the local primary schools - St Nessans, St Pauls, Gaelscoil Raithin, and the Project School.

Sports within a community plays an extremely important role in the development of our

young people. It is our aim as a club to provide all young boys, girls and young adults within our community an opportunity to come and be a part of our sports community, learning the fantastic skills of our national game, improving physical fitness, improving their social skills and improving self confidence. Sport not only leaves people with wonderful memories, but can also create lifelong friendships.

Every successful club is built from the cornerstone of a supportive community and we would like to thank you the community for your unwavering support in all our fundraisers and activities we run throughout the year. Our club is run entirely by volunteers who do a fantastic job. With the continued growth of the club we are always looking for new volunteers.

As well as our on-field activities we run an excellent Community Centre which is the centre of many social and fundraising events in the parish. Throughout the year activities such as Irish Dancing, Young at Heart Club, Taekwondo, Set Dancing, Teenage Discos, Card Playing and many club functions take place.

Mungret-St Pauls GAA is a multi ethnic facility that caters for the broader Community.

We welcome many different Nationalities who avail independently of the facilities and partake in activities including groups from Nigeria, Cameroon, Morocco, Poland, Toga, Sudan, India and Pakistan.

Mungret-St Pauls GAA Club DEVELOPMENT

Like every GAA club in the country we are constantly looking at ways to improve our facilities in Mungret for the benefit of our players, supporters and members. In 1983 the club purchased 10 acres of land from Irish Cement. The main priorities of a committee set up to develop the grounds were to provide a juvenile pitch and a clubhouse. The juvenile pitch was opened in 1985 while the clubhouse was opened in 1987. The clubhouse has been a major focal point in the parish with the hall in use every night of the week. In 2001 a further major effort began to complete the adult pitch and dressing rooms adjacent to the clubhouse and this was achieved in May 2002 when our brand new facilities were opened by the then President of the GAA Sean McCague. In 2008 a hurling wall was completed adjacent to the juvenile pitch while two dug outs were provided in the main pitch.

The club has just completed a new sand based training pitch. It will be opened for training over the next twelve months. It will be a major advantage to the club when training in wet weather.

To further improve the facilities the club is presently looking at a ten year plan to include:

- Gym facilities.
- Astra turf pitch.
- Re designation of green spaces in the area.
- Looped walk area around the perimeter.
- Flood lighting.
- Covered accommodation.
- Better club house facilities for the community centre.
- Road widening.
- Boundary fencing along the parameter of the grounds.

This is a very ambitious plan and we are satisfied that the support we have got in the past from members, players and supporters, Limerick Co Council and the National Lottery will be available to us and so enable us to provide the facilities which are so necessary in a fast developing area such as Mungret, Raheen, Dooradoyle and surrounding areas.
