Free Health Screening in Mungret GAA club house

The 29th of October is World Stroke Day, the theme for this year's Roadshow is 'Reduce your risk of Stroke', Know your Blood Pressure, 'Get it Checked'. Nurse will be available from 10am to 4pm in Mungret GAA Club House. The nurses will be available to do blood pressure checks and also discuss other risk factors for heart attack and stroke, such as high cholesterol, and provide heart health information on positive steps toward a healthier lifestyle. Each employee will receive an individualised record of their blood pressure reading and an information leaflet, which gives practical advice on what to do prevent high blood pressure and to help manage the condition. Where

necessary, the nurse will advise employees to see their doctor. All checks are conducted in complete confidence.


